What is it?

Do I get a certificate?



Beyond WHMIS goes beyond just WHMIS (Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System) training to provide a basic safety foundation for new and returning workers. All dangers originate from hazards – this course uses the acronym CHEMSAFE® to help workers learn to recognize generic hazards in their daily tasks and the acronym REACT-PPE® to control them.

The goal is to move the workers to an understanding of hazardous energies and prepare them for active participation in the Internal Responsibility System. The course puts an emphasis on the mental aspects of developing a self-aware attitude towards safety.

This course is intended for a wide range of young, new, new-hire or returning workers and is written in a Canadian legal context. Customized versions of this course for specific regions or industries are possible. This course is most suitable as a general introduction for new-hires as well as critical preparatory training for high school and trades college students. The fundamental understanding of hazards and their control creates a safer worker able to independently assess dangers.




